They must also submit an application requesting to serve. These individuals also help in many ways from assisting an elderly person who has fallen, to responding to automobile accidents, and responding to emergencies such as the major storm in June of 2023. **HISTORY OF BLANDINSVILLE CHRISTIAN CHURCH** submitted by Jean Dougherty, Church Historian – The year 2024 marks the 175<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the founding of the Blandinsville First Christian Church in 1849. I'll be submitting brief articles each month during the year with interesting tidbits from old news articles, board meeting minutes and budget meetings. The following is an excerpt from a board meeting in 1899.

"Official Meeting, October 29. Meeting was called to order by Bro. Pres. Huston. The treasurer read report of present indebtedness and what would be required to finish year free from debt. The financial question was discussed also the advisability of retaining Bro. Clements (Pastor) for another year. The majority being in favor of his staying. Bros. Willam and Hensley tendered their resignation as deacons. No further business, meeting closed. Pres. Huston, Jessie Holliday, Cleark.

Financial Report, <u>First Quarter 1899</u>: Received: \$197.08; Paid: Janitor \$10; Coal \$.90; Brooms \$.54; Hinges \$.20; Lights \$10.90; Preaching \$161.70; J.E. Grigsby \$5.88, Total Paid \$196.12 (\$196 is worth \$7,205 in 2024). <u>Second Quarter</u>: Received \$211.52; Paid Bro. Clements (Pastor) \$189.05; Janitor \$7.15; Coal \$3.95; Postage \$1.02; Lights \$10.15, Total Paid \$211.32 (\$211 is worth \$7,756 in 2024)".

Alongside Jenny, they were able to meet lifelong friends that became family. He loved to tell stories that came with working shows and sales. Once that lifestyle slowed down, you could find him farming, tending to cows or at any sporting event. Cattle shows were a part of his life spent with family and close friends traveling the summer circuits. His grandkids became involved in rodeos, and he enjoyed watching them participate. Cremation rites have been accorded. There will be a celebration of life at a later date. Jenny is Mary Killip's sister.

**GALEN OLSON**, 95, of Macomb passed away Saturday, January 20, 2024, at the Lamoine in Macomb. Galen was born August 1, 1923, in Sciota to Oscar and Clarice (Hainline) Olson. 
