SUNDAY, AUGUST 4 – 175TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION – BLANDINSVILLE FIRST CHRISTIAN CHURCH – SERVICES START AT 9:30 A.M. – Services include a choir, special music by "Just Us" and Kevin Hunt, memorabilia (scrap books, souvenirs, history), communion, and a spiritual message. BLANDINSVILLE-HIRE LIBRARY – Summer Reading Program – "Read, Renew, Repeat" – Concentrating on conservation and the environment. The program dates are June 12, 19, 26 and July 3, 10 and 24 from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon. On June 12 there were 40+ kids who participated in the program. A large planter (4'x16') that belonged to the late Georgian Deems Watson was donated to the library in her memory. The kids who attended on June 12 were able to select a plant (annual or perennial) to put in the planter. Each participant's name was placed by their selection. The kids also enjoyed a presentation by a guest speaker, books read about bees and pollination, drinks and a" bumble bee" cookie.

THE WOMEN by Kristin Hannah tells of Frances McGrath who as a young, naive nurse joins the Army Nurse Corps during the Vietnam War. It is a graphic novel that tells the tale of those who fought in the war – those who came home and those who didn't. It describes the trauma that is experienced when the wounded are brought into makeshift hospitals where life and death decisions are made. It also tells of the protestors to an unwanted war, and the disdain that soldiers and nurses experienced when they returned. This novel is available at the Blandinsville-Hire Library. HISTORY OF BLANDINSVILLE FIRST CHRISTIAN CHURCH (1849-2024) submitted by Jean Dougherty, church historian. The year 2024 marks the 175th anniversary of the founding of the Blandinsville First Christian Church in1849. The following is an excerpt from the January 12, 1930, board meeting. "The second quarterly meeting of the church board was held on Sunday afternoon Jan. 12 with the following officers present: Brothers Marion Herzog, Syphert, Cutler, Moss, Leonard, White, Burr Herzog, Green, Cox, Argenbright. Sisters Cox, Farris, Knox and Moss. The meeting was called to order by the chairman and opened with prayer by Bro. Leonard, after which the reports were given. Treasurer's report by Bro. White showed \$41.63 (worth \$749 today) in the treasury with \$306.00 (worth

\$5,457 today) indebtedness. Owing Bro. Leonard \$200.00 (worth \$3,566 today), Farmer's elevator coal \$24.99 (worth \$45) today) and cobs \$3.00 (worth \$54 today)."
