If we receive it, we will be adding ADA required improvements such as walking paths, handicapped parking, and exercise/playground equipment. We will also be installing electrical wiring underground.

History of Blandinsville First Christian Church (1849-2024) submitted by Jean Dougherty, church historian. The year 2024 marks the 175th anniversary of the founding of the Blandinsville First Christian Church. The following is an excerpt from the October 6, 1930, board meeting. "The first quarterly meeting of the church board was held Sunday, October 6, 1930, at 2:30 p.m. The meeting was called to order by the chairman Bro. Syphert and opened with prayer by Bro. Leonard. The officers present were Bros. Leonard, Syphert, White, Moss, Herzog, Knapp, Burr, Cox, Spainhower, Marion Herzog, Vernon Argenbright, Kreps, and Toland; sisters Cox, Farris, Moss and Knos. The following officers were elected and installed Sunday morning: (a) Elder for three years Bro. Herzog; (b) Elder for one year Bro. Cox; (c) Deacon for two years Bro. George Maharry; (e)Deaconesses for three years Sisters Erma Farris, Alice Knox. Bro. Marion Herzog was elected president of the church board for one year. Sister Erma Farris was elected financial secretary for three years and J.S. Beeley as clerk for a term of three years."


